Kentucky students succeed at math and science when we equip them.

Two years ago, the National Math and Science Initiative (NMSI) began its mission to raise the bar in American math and science education. Today, NMSI and its partner, AdvanceKentucky, congratulate students and teachers in Kentucky for tremendous success in the first year of our program.

By replicating a proven Advanced Placement Training and Incentive Program in high schools across the country, NMSI has already made great strides. Enrollment is up, and scores are up for students in our programs.

Newly released College Board data show that the number of exams passed by students in our participating schools' AP math, science and English classes increased by 51 percent this year—more than nine times the national average. **In Kentucky, the number of passing exams increased by 77 percent—over 13 times the national average and over four times the overall state average.**

These results confirm that many more American students can excel at math and science if given the right opportunity.

NMSI's investment is also getting more American students college ready. Overall enrollment in AP courses has increased by 70 percent in our programs. What's more, the participation by young women has gone up by 75 percent and by a remarkable 122 percent among minority students.

NMSI and AdvanceKentucky remain committed to this mission. Our American students are ready to learn. And we're ready to equip them.
